PRODUCE MUST BE GROWN BY THE EXHIBITOR

- Class 1 Four Potatoes, any variety
- Class 2 Collection of fresh herbs - minimum 4 varieties
- Class 3 Two onions
- Class 4 One vegetable courgette
- Class 5 One vegetable marrow
- Class 6 One buttercup pumpkin
- Class 7 Two beetroot
- Class 8 Two pods of dwarf beans
- Class 9 Two pods climbing beans
- Class 10 Two sticks of rhubarb
- Class 11 Two apple cucumbers
- Class 12 Two long cucumbers
- Class 13 Two stalks of silverbeet - may be put in a jar of water to prevent wilting
- Class 14 Two stalks of spinach - may be put in a jar of water to prevent wilting

- Class 16 Three kinds salad vegs, one of each

- Class 60 Three kinds of cut flowers, one stem or spray of each
- Class 61 Dahlia bloom up to 10cm across
- Class 62 Dahlia bloom larger than 10cm across
- Class 63 Rose bloom - any variety
- Class 64 Single bloom - any flower other than rose or dahlia
- Class 65 Specimen spray or cluster
- Class 66 Potted foliage plant (must be owned by entrant for at least 3 months)
- Class 67 Potted flowering plant (must be owned by entrant for at least 3 months)
- Class 68 Three kinds of foliage
